Rev Peter Chandler's Obituary, as told by Abigail, Sanchia, Gabriel, and Sister Verona

Peter Chandler was born in December of 1953, in Mutare, Zimbabwe. He was the second son of Eldridge and Audrey Chandler. As the son of a chief engineer, our dad was often found tinkering with tools at his father's side, mending bicycles and broken toys. As he grew older, his skills turned to making toys, and occasionally catapults to ward off the neighbourhood bullies. This was where his mother's influence came in. Our grandmother, Audrey, would often tell him to, "Rise above it." This saying has been passed down for generations.

Dad was an exceptional student with a great fondness for books and music. The Chandlers were a musical family. Our dad's father was a talented pianist who passed on his love of music to both of his sons. Dad was a multi-instrumentalist, playing the piano, guitar, and almost any instrument he got his hands on. He grew up with the sound of classical music playing throughout the rooms of his family's home in Bulawayo.

Despite being raised in a segregated Zimbabwe, our dad discovered his love for the African flavours in the helpers' quarters of his family's home. He'd laugh as he told us stories of how the workers often hid him from his parents and taught him how to dip sadza in their delicious Zimbabwe stew.

As a teenager, dad was a prefect and top student at Hamilton High School, where he also learned to speak French fluently. But his engineering genes leaped to the next level, and his new interests involved making, building and then riding his own motorcycle.

Dad once told us the story of an afternoon when a teacher was cross with the class and told them they would all have to stay behind after school. But Dad was keen to get back home to continue working on his motorbike. The teacher said either you write two pages or come to the front of the class and get four dorks. For Dad, the choice was easy, and he walked straight to the front of the class to receive his punishment with the cane.

Despite his preference for outdoor pursuits, dad graduated and left Zimbabwe to join his older brother in London.

As a newly independent young man, he was ready to embark on his studies at the university and to see the world. He made a start by exploring Europe on a motorbike. But God had another plan for his life.

After being witnessed to, dad became a devoted Christian and was baptised in a Pentecostal church in Camberwell.



In 1977, he met a young lady by the name of Monica, who was a new convert. After hearing her testimony, he asked her to assist him with his outreach. Whilst working together, they discovered they had a lot in common and a friendship developed, centred on their cause for Christ. Dad proposed to mum one day as they walked through Larkhall Park. Mum accepted, but her family's response to their engagement is a story best told by someone who was there.

I remember it was a lovely, bright sunny afternoon when Monica brought this tall, handsome man home to speak to our dad, because he wanted to ask for her hand in marriage. Our dad was apprehensive about giving his daughter away to a man he shared no physical or cultural similarities with. But in the years that followed, Peter proved to him and to our whole family that he was a man of principle. He quickly earned our family's trust and respect with his sincere demeanour and unwavering integrity.

I still remember their engagement because it was one with a difference. There was a spiritual visitation. People were speaking in tongues and prophesying.

Our mum and dad were married in the autumn of 1978. Dad continued evangelising and preaching, and this was also the year the church officially started. During this time, dad was part of a legal team that successfully established a government initiative called Motobility. This was to enable people with disabilities to have cars customised to suit their specific needs. The initial launch took place in the State House in the West End of London.

A dedicated group formed from dad's evangelical work, and they soon became a church of message believers. The church grew and our family grew too. Three years later, Dad and mum became the parents of three children. Abigail, Sanchia, and Gabriel. Dad's ministry became global, and our family travelled a lot together to different countries around the world. We frequently travelled to Belgium, Germany, Italy, Holland, France, Poland, and the Czech Republic.

In 1985, our dad felt led to host a convention in Wales. It was attended by believers across the globe. Acts of the supernatural were seen in those meetings. Many people received the Holy Spirit, even on the plane home. In Holland, Europeans were liberated in the holy spirit during meetings. In Belgium, the holy ghost fell on the people - before he had even started preaching. During one significant meeting, a visitor gave an account of a vision he was having during the preaching. In this vision, he saw dad singing the song 'Across the Bridge.' And then, to his amazement, our dad raised the song and the place was electrified with an outpouring of the holy spirit.

A photo was taken of dad at the pulpit, and this is what the French photographer saw when the film was printed. He took the picture to a laboratory to get it examined, and the photographer later verified that it was (in his words) mystic. Dad's ministry impacted believers all over the world, especially in Belgium, South Africa, and the United States. Visions were seen and lives were changed; spiritual manifestations happened as he preached. There were unforgettable messages such as...

- **Right time, right place, right season,**
- **There is nothing.**
- **There is my spirit flowing freely**
- **Riders of Judgment**

Whilst pastoring the church at home, he ministered in conventions in the Caribbean, the United States, South America, Canada, Africa, and Europe. The last visit he made was to Ivory Coast.



In the early years, dad undertook a lot of missionary work in Africa, visiting countries like Malawi, Kenya, Ghana, South Africa, Nigeria, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, and Congo. The believers in our church know our dad was a proud African. He loved Africa. The jacaranda trees, the sunshine, the food, and most of all, the people. In every corner of Africa he preached in, he integrated effortlessly into the local communities. There is a video of dad preaching in a small village in Africa. He was standing outside under a large tree, and when he wanted to demonstrate the seven church ages to the people he was speaking to; he picked a stick off the ground and drew it out for them in the sand. Just as Christ did, he used the sand as his blackboard.

Dad's ministry placed a strong emphasis on youth work. He made the youth a priority from very early in his ministry. The first youth camp that LCA ever had was in Hengrave Hall in the mid 80's.



This included children as young as two and three years old. Over the years, the LCA Youth retreats became very popular, progressing to Ashburnham, Carroty Wood, High Lee, Cefn Lee, Capstone Park and Gilwell Park. Their success attracted children from other churches worldwide. As children, we saw mighty outpourings of the Holy Spirit on the youth, and many of them have testified that these were some of the best days of their lives. Dad's dedication to youth work did not stop at youth conventions. He also supported many plays, excursions, youth services, seminars, and LCA choir events. We shared our dad with the children and youth of LCA and Europe. Yet, we experienced the most unforgettable moments with them. Some of the friendships we built during those camps remain just as strong to this day.

For 46 years, our dad served God's people faithfully. As with all churches, LCA had ups and downs throughout those years, but dad's calling to serve never wavered. As children, we didn't understand the strength behind dad's silence. He never spoke a bad word about anyone, not from the pulpit, not on the phone or even on the long car journeys home from church. His lips were God's tool to use for God's purpose. Whenever we came to him with a problem, he would ask us, "What would Jesus do?" That was the standard dad set for himself. He lived the virtues he preached about. We saw him demonstrate them many times throughout our lives. He loved people. Even the people we knew had wronged him. His sermons were filled with wisdom, and he continually emphasised the importance of having those virtues. But the life he lived was his greatest example, and for that we are so proud to call him our dad.

The last few years have been so full of memorable moments for our family. Dad was such a wonderful grandfather (papa) to his eight grandchildren. Our family all live within five minutes of each other, and our visits often included a trip to papas' house to help mend a broken toy or bike tyre.

Just as he had with his own father, Papa was always fixing something. That's how he got the nickname "Papa-fix-it." But he didn't only fix broken toys. When his grandchildren had nightmares, he taught them how to pray, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. It fills our hearts with joy to hear them pray using the words their papa taught them.

The day our dad was taken to glory was a life-altering moment for us and for our extended family, who were all close to dad too. But heaven was always his destination. Since we were children, dad told us where he would be going one day. He preached about that glorious land for 46 years. Heaven wasn't just a personal goal for dad; he preached to bring as many people as he could there too. We know where our dad is. He told us all our lives, even in the Ivory Coast meeting, he said he'd be going up yonder to be with the lord. That's where he is.

His passing took us by surprise, and yet, there were so many supernatural signs surrounding his departure, many things. There were dreams, visions, and just such a precision that has left us all in awe.

It was only in February that dad had his annual extensive medical check. Nothing flagged up. In fact, he was told that his body age was 4 years younger than his actual age. He had a big grin on his face when he told us that one. Even his doctor called our mum in total shock when he received the news that dad had passed on. Days later, when mum went into dad's office, she found a file of all his important documents on his desk. It was as if he knew she would need them.

The morning he passed, he drove our mum and grandma to London. But God's perfect timing spared us from burying all three. Dad drove more than 50 miles that day. He even went into shops to get supplies and little treats for his grandchildren. But God made sure he was at the church, in his office, at his pastoral post of duty. God was compassionate. He didn't take him home in front of his church or in front of his family. Only a stranger was there - who had no knowledge of CPR. We were later informed dad's soul left his body before he hit the ground. He was taken in the blink of an eye. God was merciful. As my sister and I stepped inside the church that day, we were immediately aware of a tangible presence. We both felt it. It was like an awe or a sacredness or a reverence. It was like walking into a holy place. We didn't want to talk or move too much. The atmosphere we were in felt almost frightening. It was like we were standing in the presence of a higher being. It reminded me of when Brother Branham spoke about meeting the angel. I believe there were angels there to escort Dad home. The look on his face was so peaceful. We all said he looked like he was smiling. We were so close; his absence will be deeply felt by all of us.

Since before we were born, Dad led a purpose-filled life that was dedicated to God. He faithfully pursued the path that God directed him towards. Growing up as pastor's kids, we understood that our father's boss was God. The Lord called him to spread the gospel, to preach in countries all over the world, and now God has called him home.

Our Dad entered eternal rest at his post of duty on the 10th of April 2024. He departed this life as he had lived it – in the service of God. Thousands of tributes have been flooding in from over the globe, with many sharing personal accounts of dad's kindness. He helped so many people throughout his life. We never knew the extent, because as a pastor, he always maintained confidentiality. He was an extraordinary man with such a big heart, who gave so much of himself and his time to others. For us, this confirms God was pleased with his work and brought his servant home to rest. And as the bible says...

And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die.

In the late 1990's, after a convention in Belgium, dad took a detour on the way home and brought us to a town called Ypres. We got out of the car and walked to the large Menin Gate memorial. I remember looking at the thousands of names of the soldiers who had died in this place during World War 1. Dad brought us to the part of the memorial where all the Chandlers were listed. There were so many. Then he told us that his grandfather had fought here at the battle of Ypres and he was shot in the leg. He said that if that soldier who shot my great-grandfather had aimed his gun an inch higher, my great-grandfather's name would have been there on that wall with all the other chandlers and none of us would be standing there that day.

Dad had respect for his history, for what it had cost for him to exist and an appreciation for how precious life is. But what he felt most strongly was the power of God's foreknowledge and predestination. Great-grandfather survived because Peter Chandler had to exist. God had a plan for his life and a work for him to do. He was protecting him from before he was born.

That gunshot, which fired one inch too low, resulted in thousands of lives being touched around the world and a life lived pointing souls to Christ.

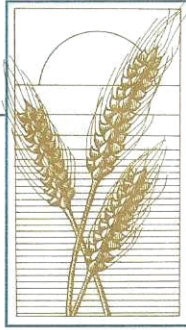
